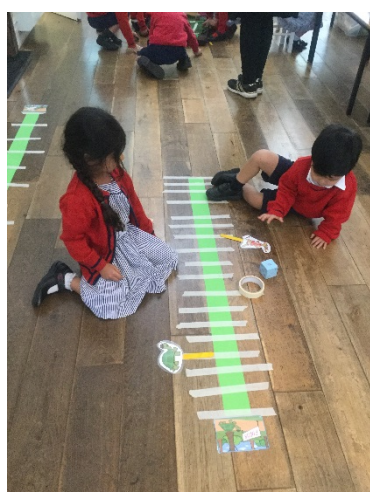
This week we have also been very busy with our preparations for sports day. The children are demonstrating their competitive nature but at the same time ensuring they are completing the race in the correct sequence.
