### Project: **“Wild and wonderful”**

Dear Parents,

The activity for week: 2 beginning: 15<sup>th</sup> January 2024

is: **‘Wild Wolves’**

---

#### **The activity we will be covering involves:**

- Learn about wolf behaviour, lifestyle and habitat
- Explain where and how a wolf lives
- Describe typical wolf behaviour e.g. lives in packs/ howls at the moon
- Learn new vocabulary and communicate their ideas and thoughts
- Encouraging critical thinking
- Sustaining attentive listening, responding to what they have heard with relevant comments, questions or actions
- Working creatively during the activity and following instructions
- Developing fine motor skills.

#### **Our activity includes:**

- Start a conversation with the children about wolves;
  - Read “There is no Big Bad Wolf in this story” by Lou Carter to the children;
  - Discuss with the children about wolves, their behaviour, lifestyle and habitat;
  - Watch a short factual child-friendly video about wolves;
  - Followed by crafty activities where children will create the Big Bad Wolf.

#### **Our suggested activities are:**

- Read and act out some wolf fairy tales such as:  
    **“The Three Little Pigs”**      **“The Boy Who Cried Wolf”**  
    **“Little Red Riding Hood”**
- Play **“What is the time Mr Wolf?”** with your child
- Visit the local library to look and read some factual books about wolves
