

The Lower Nursery and Upper Nursery children have been very busy exploring their new environment. Our Montessori practical life shelf activities throughout the school have been a huge hit with new and challenging activities carefully set out on the shelves to engage the children. We follow the children's interests so that their interest is sparked even more intensely. They have already explored so many different resources including polishing, pouring activities, pegging, sieving as well as exploring simple to complex puzzles, hole

The children have been settling in and learning the school routine, demonstrating independence in various ways such as putting their coats on their pegs as they enter the classroom in the mornings and placing water bottles on the designated table. We have been very impressed by how little support the children need to eat their snack or lunch. We also focus on good table manners during these times and the children do not start eating until everyone has been served. Please do not overload the Tupperware as only a small snack is needed. We also offer milk to the children at snack time. The children are also learning all the different names in class including the teachers and we have been playing many turn taking games to reflect this.

The most frequented places in Lower Nursery these past 3 weeks are most definitely the practical life activities and the home corner. They are very sweetly acting out home scenarios and the children's characters are already coming out which is adorable to see.

In the garden, the children enjoy playing with all the equipment available, especially the wooden car and our garden slide which they are already learning to independently climb. They have been intrigued by the wheelbarrows with some children trying hard to manoeuvre around the garden collecting leaves as they go along.

During circle time our focus has been singing nursery rhymes and number songs and their faces have lit up, with some impressively joining in with the words or actions. The children have also been introduced to runny glue and spatulas. We have a dedicated art area where the children are encouraged to independently choose materials to create collages, snip with scissors and mark make. They have been very interested in mark making especially tracing using the Montessori Insets for design.




If your child stays for club, snack should also be a piece of fruit.

We are still finding dried fruit and grapes in snack boxes- grapes are not permitted as they present a choking hazard and dried fruit has a high sugar content.




